The Regional Galleries Association of Queensland Board met regularly throughout 2014 to discuss programs and membership, develop ways to grow our services for members and raise the organisation's profile within the sector. The year has been one of review with the Board keen to establish increased membership engagement and opportunities as well as philanthropic support to assist with financing further programs in the coming years.

Once again, RGAQ's professional development programs funded through membership income provided numerous opportunities for organisations and individuals and continue to be our most valuable benefit. I am pleased to say that RGAQ provided \$10,175 (+GST) to individual and organisational members for professional and exhibition/program development activities.

Museum & Gallery Services Queensland continued to deliver high-quality programs and initiatives to the sector throughout 2014. RGAQ was proud to partner with M&GSQ on the presentation of the Energy Efficiency Information Resources for the Public Museum and Gallery Sector. These included *Practical Guide for Sustainable Climate Control and Lighting in Museums and Galleries; A Case Study on Lighting for Museums and Galleries* and *Clever Custodians* which provides quick tips and other initiatives for improving the energy efficiency of small-to-medium museums and galleries. These valuable resources are all available through the M&GSQ website.

The Board of RGAQ ensures the gallery sector's input into M&GSQ activities and decision making through representation by two RGAQ board members on the M&GSQ Board. I thank John Waldron (up to 27 June 2014) and Karina Devine for once again taking up this responsibility.

There were some new faces added to the RGAQ Board in 2014. I would like to welcome Nina Shadforth, Claire Sourgnes and Anna Thurgood to the team and thank our previous Directors Dawn Oelrich, Chris Stannard and John Waldron for sharing their knowledge, expertise and ideas during their tenure. I also acknowledge the ongoing work of Board members, John Walsh, Karina Devine and Brian Tucker for their continued guidance of the organisation and the services of Natasha Lewis Honeyman, Membership Officer throughout 2014. I would also like to thank the staff of M&GSQ for the ongoing services they provide for RGAQ throughout the year.

Your support and input as members is crucial to the ongoing vitality of RGAQ as an organisation that represents the interests and concerns of the public gallery sector in Queensland. Through regular review and consultation, RGAQ strives to ensure that its membership services meet the changing needs of our members.

RGAQ Professional Development Bursary Program

In 2014, RGAQ allocated \$5,000 (plus GST) for Professional Development Bursaries as part of the 2014 budgeting process. RGAQ released additional funds to support member attendance at the 5th National Public Galleries Summit 2015 and awarded \$10,175 (plus GST) in total to successful individual and organisational applicants.

Museum & Gallery Services Queensland - Highlights of 2014

M&GSQ's 2014 touring exhibition program presented 9 exhibitions to 29 venues in Queensland and nationally, attracting a total of 204,392 visitors – an increase of 64.6% on 2013 visitation.

M&GSQ's number of e-bulletin subscribers grew to 1,170 – an increase of 12% on 2013.

M&GSQ in partnership with Gold Coast City Gallery launched its international touring exhibition *Saltwater Country* in 2014. More than 6,100 visitors engaged with the exhibition at the Gold Coast from 19 July to 31 August 2014.

M&GSQ's website registered 207,631 entry page views in 2014. There were 2,732 visits to M&GSQ's Blog; 862 'likes' on M&GSQ's Facebook page, an increase of 41% on 2013; and 292 followers on Twitter, an increase of 35%.

418 participants took part in 22 M&GSQ training and professional development activities in 2014. A further 378 participants took part in 15 Sector Development activities supported by M&GSQ in 2014.

The NETS Australia website attracted 22,376 page views in 2014. M&GSQ is the Queensland agency for NETS Australia.

5 organisations took part in M&GSQ's 2014 Standards Review Program held in North Queensland. 8 Standards Reviewers contributed 475 unpaid hours of their expertise to the program. The Standards Review Program is a joint program with Museums & Galleries of New South Wales.

M&GSQ's publications *Source* and *Standards Community Directory* attracted 4,553 downloads from M&GSQ's website during the year.

M&GSQ launched its revitalised website in December 2014, along with the Company's new trading name, Museums & Galleries Queensland.
