President's Report

The Regional Galleries Association of Queensland Board continued to meet regularly throughout 2015 to discuss programs and membership, develop ways to grow our services for our members and raise the organisation's profile, and the profile of our member galleries, within the sector.

Our main objective in 2015 was the upgrade and development of a new RGAQ Website and Facebook page. I am pleased to report that our new website is live (www.rgag.org.au), and our Facebook page continues to grow in popularity and relevance. Both initiatives have resulted in increased membership engagement and opportunities.

Once again, in 2015 RGAO's professional development programs funded through membership income provided numerous opportunities for organisations and individuals, and continue to be our most valuable benefit. I am pleased to say that RGAQ provided \$4,370 (+GST) to individual and organisational members for professional and exhibition/program development activities, and note that Diana Warnes' valuable opportunity as volunteer attendant at the new Australian Pavilion at the 56th Venice Biennale, is profiled in this year's report.

Throughout the year RGAQ met with Museums Australia Queensland and Museums and Galleries Queensland through joint meetings to discuss partnered activities and joint membership promotions. 2015 was the year that planning commenced for the Museums Galleries Australia National Conference being held in Brisbane in May 2017, where a spirit of partnership and collaboration is vital for successful delivery of this conference. RGAO's main objective is to ensure adequate and relevant coverage of gallery content at the conference (#mgaconf2017). www.mga2017.org.au.

In its second year of operation, I would like to thank the 2014-elected RGAO Board for their continued support and contribution throughout 2015, and acknowledge retiring Director John Walsh for his dedicated service to RGAQ over the years including his tireless role as President of RGAQ for 16 years between 1998 and 2013. I also acknowledge the services of Natasha Lewis Honeyman (Membership Officer 2013-2015), and wish her well in her future role. In 2015 we welcomed back Karike Ashworth into the Membership Officer role in an extended capacity of one day per week.

Museums & Galleries Queensland continued to deliver high-quality programs and initiatives to the sector throughout 2015, and I would like to thank all the M&G QLD staff for the ongoing services they provide for RGAQ throughout the year. Most notable was delivery of the M&G OLD Conference at The Workshops Rail Museum, Ipswich. Through 2013-2015 RGAQ was proud to partner with M&G QLD on the presentation of the Energy Efficiency Information Resources for the Public Museum and Gallery Sector. The final stage of this program was concluded in 2015.

Your support and input as members is crucial to the ongoing vitality of RGAQ as an organisation that represents the interests and concerns of the public gallery sector in Queensland. Through regular review and consultation, RGAQ strives to ensure that its membership services meet the changing needs of our members.

RGAQ Professional Development Bursary Program

In 2015, RGAQ allocated \$5,000 (plus GST) for Professional Development Bursaries as part of the RGAQ Board 2015 budgeting process. RGAQ offered two programs to address the training and professional development needs of galleries/museums, their staff and their volunteers:

Bursary Profile

In 2015, Diana Warnes (Curator of the Rockhampton Art Gallery) had the opportunity to work as a Volunteer Gallery Attendant at the brand new Australian Pavilion at the 56th Venice Biennale. Diana received funding from Rockhampton Regional Council plus a \$500 RGAQ bursary to assist with her international flights and travel insurance costs. She also received support for her accommodation and per diem costs from the Australia Council.

Undertaking the role of Volunteer Gallery Attendant was a unique opportunity to participate in promoting contemporary Australian art to an international audience. I learnt a variety of skills, including: exhibition display; curatorial decision-making; participatory audience engagement; networking; and how to communicate with diverse audiences.

At the request of the Rockhampton Art Gallery Director, I wrote a weekly written report of my time at Venice, which was posted on the Gallery's website, and promoted via the Gallery's Facebook page. I also presented a talk to Friends of the Gallery at 'Good Brew Chats', a monthly conversation about visual arts topics to the general public.

Museums & Galleries Queensland - Highlights of 2015

M&G QLD's number of e-bulletin subscribers grew to 1,327 – an increase of 13.42% on 2014.

272 participants took part in 17 M&G QLD training and professional development activities in 2015.

M&G QLD's website registered 149,126 entry page views in 2015. There were 1,533 visits to M&G QLD's Blog; 5,066 'likes' on M&G QLD's Facebook page, an increase of 487.7% on 2014; and 374 followers on Twitter, an increase of 28%.

A further 758 participants took part in 21 Sector Development activities delivered by M&G QLD in 2015.

M&G QLD's publications *source* and "Standards Community Directory" attracted 1,551 downloads from M&G QLD's website during the year.

5 organisations took part in M&G QLD's 2015 Standards Review Program held in the Mackay region and Noosa. 7 Standards Reviewers contributed 471 pro bono hours of their expertise to the program. The Standards Review Program is a joint program with Museums & Galleries of New South Wales.

M&G QLD's 2015 touring exhibition program presented 7 exhibitions to 33 venues in Queensland, nationally and internationally, attracting a total of 95,576 visitors. These exhibitions profiled the work of 91 artists and 6 curators.

M&G QLD recognised the achievements of 5 Winners and 7 Finalists at the 2015 Gallery and Museum Achievement Awards. This year's Winners were presented with an exquisite trophy specially created for the event by Queensland artist Madeleine Brown.

M&G QLD toured its major Indigenous exhibition *Saltwater Country* to AAMU, Museum of Contemporary Aboriginal Art, The Netherlands, in 2015, where more than 6,730 visitors engaged with the exhibition. 1,457 of these were education and public programs participants. Saltwater Country was developed in partnership with Gold Coast City Gallery and is touring nationally 2015–2017.

M&G QLD completed the final stage of the Energy Efficiency Information Resources for Public Museum and Gallery Sector Project, launching the second edition of A Practical Guide for Sustainable Lighting and Climate Control for Museums and Galleries; A Case Study on Lighting for Museums and Galleries; and Clever Custodians online and hardcopy resources.
